ABUSE

Abuse can happen to anyone. It can be physical, sexual, emotional, financial, or any combination of these. Abuse may be committed by a current or former partner/spouse, a family member, a caregiver, a friend, a stranger, etc.

Abuse is a crime and victims of abuse are protected by civil and criminal law. You can make an application to the courts for an order of protection. You can also contact the local police or RCMP about criminal charges.

If you have been a victim of domestic or sexual violence, it's important to know you don't deserve to be abused. And you are not alone. There are many services here to help you, including crisis lines, resource centres, shelters, residential programs, and other agencies that provide counselling.

Note: You will also find similar services listed in the Aboriginal Services chapter and the Support for Families chapter.

CHILD CARE

There are many child care options available to parents in Manitoba, including licensed, early learning and child care centres, homes and nursery schools, as well as unlicensed child care provided in home settings. Parents may also seek temporary or casual care for their children. Some of these child care options are explained below.

LICENSED EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE

Licensed centres/homes are inspected and monitored by the Manitoba government (Manitoba Early Learning and Child Care). They must meet government standards in many areas, including health and safety, staff training and ratios, programming, equipment, behaviour management policies, health and nutrition guidelines, and more. Quality early learning and child care supports a child's emotional, social, intellectual and physical development. It also keeps children safe and happy, in a caring environment.

In Manitoba, families can choose full-time or part-time care in a licensed child care centre, a family child care home or a nursery school.

Child Care Centres

Child care centres offer one or more of the following types of programs:

Full-Time Infant and Preschool

- for children three months to six years of age
- typically open from 6:00 or 6:30 a.m. to 5:30 or 6:00 p.m.
- evening, overnight or weekend care may be available

Nursery School

- for preschool children under six years of age
- for parents who may or may not work outside the home, but still want an enriching experience for their children
- usually operate for two or three hours a day, and from two to five days a week

School Age

- for children five to 12 years of age
- for children while they are not in school (ex: before or after school, lunch hours, teacher in-service days, school holidays)

Child Care Homes

This type of licensed child care is offered in the caregiver's own home. There are two types:

Family Child Care Home

Can accept:

- up to eight children under age 12
- no more than five children under age 6
- no more than three children under age 2

The caregiver's own children (under age 12) are included in the maximum numbers allowed.

Group Child Care Home

- two caregivers work together in the home of one of the caregivers
- can accept up to 12 children under age 12, with no more than three children under age 2

Subsidies

Subsidy Information Services

Subsidies help lower the cost of child care for eligible parents and are only available for children enrolled in licensed child care. They are available at all provincially funded centres, homes and nursery schools, and at some non-funded programs. To be eligible for subsidy (other than subsidy for nursery school), parents must show a reason for needing child care (ex: employed, in training, attending school or university, looking for a job or having a medical or special need). A special income-based subsidy for families wanting a part-time nursery school experience for their preschool children is also available at most licensed nursery schools. For these subsidies, families do not need a reason for service, such as working or going to school, to qualify.

UNLICENSED CHILD CARE

Private home child care is unlicensed care provided in a family home. Under Manitoba law, a caregiver at a private home may operate without a licence and offer care for a maximum of four children under the age of 12, with no more than two children under the age of 2. The caregiver's own children are included in these numbers. If more children than this are receiving care, the home must be licensed by the Manitoba government as a family child care home.

Parents have the right to ask an unlicensed caregiver for both a child abuse registry check and a criminal record check. (It is recommended that you ask for a criminal record check that includes a "vulnerable sector screening," which provides more detailed information, such as a sexual offence where a pardon has been granted.) Other important considerations include caregivers' qualifications and whether they have emergency first-aid and CPR training.

Babysitting and Home Alone

Sometimes parents need to find temporary or casual care for their children. According to Manitoba law, children under the age of 12 are not allowed to stay home alone. Once your child turns 12, he or she is legally old enough, in Manitoba, to stay home alone, and to

care for younger children or siblings. Some 12-year-olds are ready to be alone for short periods of time; others may not be ready. To see whether your 12-year-old is ready to stay home alone, ask them if they'd know what to do in a difficult situation or an emergency.

Babysitting courses, and courses on staying home alone, are available. These courses teach children how to deal with common issues. Check with your local resource centre, library, community centre, YMCA-YWCA or any other organization to find a course near you.

EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME ASSISTANCE (EIA), MANITOBA ENTREPRENEURSHIP, TRAINING AND TRADE

EIA provides benefits (in the form of money) to help Manitobans with no other way to support themselves or their families. These benefits help with the costs of basic needs like food, clothing, housing and health costs. For people who are able to work, EIA provides support to help them find employment.

Applying for EIA

Before you fill out an application for EIA benefits, you may need to complete a pre-intake orientation. Once that's done, EIA staff will set up an intake appointment for you to complete an EIA application. Other EIA Benefits

Along with income support, you may qualify for additional benefits from EIA. For example, EIA may help with the costs of:

- a new baby (ex: crib, layette)
- beds and bedding (a mattress, box spring and frame for each person in the home every seven years; new bedding every three years)
- child care, including the cost of getting children to and from childcare while you're working, going to school or in job training
- needed home repairs (if you own your home)
- moving, in special cases (ex: home is unsafe; a change in family size; finding lower rent; or moving closer to a job or training)
- electricity, fuel, etc. in northern and remote communities
- replacing identification (ID), if yours is lost, stolen, or destroyed
- school supplies for dependent children (under 18) who go to school full-time (the amount depends on the child's age)
- damage or security deposits for your home
- basic furniture – a one-time start-up allowance – if furniture is not included in the rent (available only in certain situations)

Speak to EIA staff for more details on these benefits.

Health Needs

As a single parent, you are eligible for benefits for necessary prescription drugs from the time you enrol with EIA. You are also eligible for dental and optical services after a three-month waiting period. During the waiting period, benefits may be provided in emergencies. You may also be eligible for benefits for other health needs (ex: addictions treatment, ambulance service, transportation for medical appointments, telephones for health and safety reasons). If you get a job, you and your children may be eligible to have your health benefits continue for up to two years. Talk to EIA staff for more information on health benefits.

Note: Even if you are not eligible for EIA income assistance, you may be eligible for support for your health needs (on a one-time or ongoing basis). See the chapter on Health Care and Disability Services for more information.

Child Support

Child or spousal support orders and agreements from former partners must be declared to EIA. These payments are counted as income, and will be taken off your monthly EIA payments. Usually, EIA requires single parents to take steps to get child support (if they have not already done so). However, in certain situations, you may not be required to get support – for example, if there is reason to believe that doing so would lead to violence by your former partner.

Appeals

If you disagree with a decision made about your income support or benefits, speak with EIA staff and they will review the decision with you. If you still disagree, you may speak to the supervisor of your EIA office. You also have the right to appeal to an independent group called the Social Services Appeal Board if:

- your application was denied
- your assistance was cancelled, suspended, reduced or withheld
- you think your assistance amount is not enough to meet your basic needs
- you believe you had to wait too long for a decision, after applying for support or an increase in support.

You have 30 days after the decision is made to file your appeal in writing.

LEGAL AID MANITOBA

Legal Aid Manitoba provides legal advice and representation to eligible low-income individuals and groups, including for the following matters:

- family issues such as divorce, child custody, maintenance enforcement and child protection matters
- adults and youth who are facing serious criminal charges
- people with disputes involving Employment and Income Assistance, Workers Compensation, Canada Pension Plan disability, and the Personal Injury Protection Plan under Manitoba Public Insurance, as well as Residential Tenancies Branch cases
- groups and individuals with test cases in the areas of consumer, poverty, environmental, Aboriginal and Charter of Rights challenges

To determine if someone is eligible, Legal Aid looks at income, assets and debts and whether money will be available to pay legal fees at the end of the case. If you are applying for a separation, but still live with your spouse/partner, your eligibility is not affected by your spouse/partner's financial resources. If you have assets that are enough to pay for a lawyer, you may be refused legal aid. If your assets are locked in and you are not able to use them, or if using them would cause you a great deal of hardship, Legal Aid may be able to assist you.

If you qualify for Legal Aid, the services of a lawyer may be provided for free, or you may be expected to pay back some or all of your Legal Aid fees, depending on your financial situation. Even if you are expected to partially or fully pay back Legal Aid, it is still more affordable than hiring a private lawyer.

If you receive Legal Aid services, and you receive a lump sum payment at the end of your case (ex: if there is a substantial

financial divorce settlement), there may be an expectation of payment of some or all legal fees.

To apply for Legal Aid in Winnipeg, go to the Application Centre (call ahead for hours). You can also apply at the Legal Aid Manitoba offices located in Brandon, Dauphin, The Pas and Thompson. Lawyers and paralegals regularly travel to more than 40 outlying communities. There is a \$25 non-refundable fee to apply for Legal Aid (this fee is waived if you rely on social assistance, are in a women's shelter, are a full-time student, or are in a mental health facility). Legal Aid Manitoba has several offices in Winnipeg – for information on other locations, see their website or contact the Administration Office.

Family Conciliation Services, Manitoba Family Services and Labour

Family Conciliation Services provides conflict resolution services (at no cost) to families going through separation or divorce. Family Conciliation Services is provincewide, with offices in Winnipeg, Brandon, Dauphin, Thompson, The Pas and Flin Flon. Referrals to Family Conciliation may be made by the court, your lawyer, Legal Aid, a social service agency, or you may decide to come on your own. Family Conciliation Services offers the following programs:

- **For the Sake of the Children** is an information program offered to parents to help them understand what they are going through, both legally and emotionally, and to learn more about the needs of children after separation. New court rules make program attendance compulsory for Manitobans requesting or responding to requests for interim or final orders for child custody, access, or private guardianship.

- **Mediation** is an alternative to traditional court action. It is for parents willing to meet and work together with a skilled, professional counsellor to make decisions about their children's ongoing needs after separation. Mediation can also be used to deal with the financial issues related to the separation, such as child support, spousal support and division of marital property.
- **Conciliation Counselling** provides short-term counselling for individuals, couples or families in the process of separation or divorce. It is not marriage counselling or couple counselling; rather, it is focused on short-term, problem solving and provides support and information.
- **Caught in the Middle** is a group for children ages 8 to 12 whose parents are in disagreement over separation and divorce issues.
- **Just for Teens** is a seminar for teens ages 12-17. (In the Brandon area, a workshop for children ages 14-17 is offered to help them adjust to their parents' separation.
- **The Grandparent Advisor Service** offers support, information, counselling and mediation to grandparents and family members seeking access to children.
- **The Brief Consultation Service** is a court-referred service that provides a brief consultation to parents, and the court, to help address the wishes or concerns of children ages 11 to 16. A report is forwarded to the court with recommendations on access.
- **Court-Ordered Assessments** help determine what is in the best interests of the children, when separating parents can't agree on decisions about their children.
- **First Choice Service** is an alternative to a traditional court-ordered assessment. It is a combination of assessment, mediation and settlement that helps parents resolve their custody or access issues more quickly.

CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES

Manitoba's child and family services (CFS) system provides services to communities, families and children. They include counselling, education, emergency assistance, practical support, treatment and temporary care. Temporary care includes foster care or residential care (while family concerns are being addressed), or appropriate permanent care (including adoption) when reunification is no longer possible.

Foster homes are approved and managed by the mandated authorities. Individuals interested in becoming foster parents should contact the agency or authority in their area. Those interested in adoption should contact the adoption department of a child and family services agency or a licensed adoption agency.
